

Mining Briefs: Musgrave, Spectrum and more

In *Mining Briefs* today: Musgrave makes thick gold find; Spectrum signs farm-in; TNG cheers electrolyte production; Gold Road completes resource drilling; and lithium finds for Birimian and Dakota.

Musgrave Minerals has hit the thickest high grade gold intersection yet at the Break of Day mine on its Cue project in Western Australia's Murchison region.

Recent assays from reverse circulation drilling returned results of 13m at 15.6 grams per tonne gold from 165m downhole, which extended the high grade interval of one drillhole to 21m at 21.5gpt gold from 157m downhole.

Musgrave said it had now received assay results for the first 15 holes of a 24-hole program, with assay results to be received in batches over the next four weeks.

The company said it would extend the drill program a further 2000m, with a diamond drilling program to begin later this quarter.
